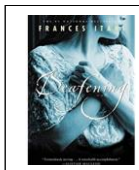

Generation of Young Farmers?**

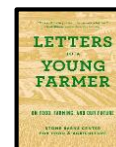

Learn about Stone Barns' Growing Farmers Initiative, a nine-month apprenticeship program that educates beginning farmers in the practice of agroecology and the business of building economically and ecologically resilient farm enterprises.
